ATTENTION : The composition of those chords is interchangeable, so please feel free to adapt the compositions of the chords according to your own tastes and preferences.

For example, the F major chord can be played:

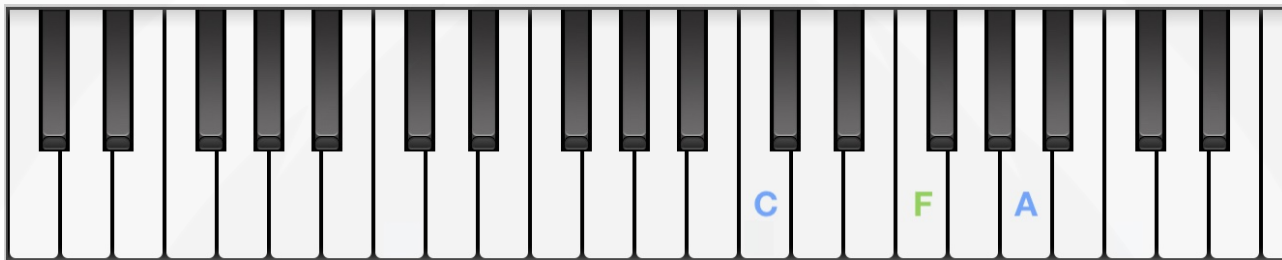
- C / F / A (see table) (**2nd inversion**)
- **But also** F / A / C (**Standard**)
- **Or** A / C / F (**1st inversion**)

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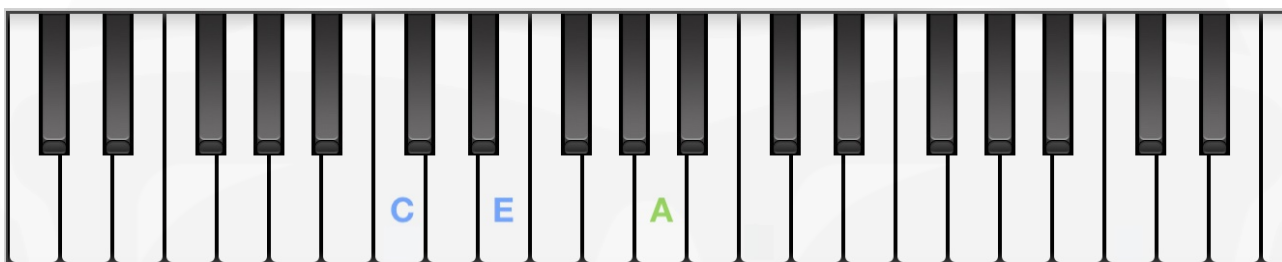

Chords order for the introduction

Introduction : Play this table 2 times.

The song directly continues with the chorus.

Once you've finished this chart, you can continue the chorus with the next chart, which is pretty much the same, with a change in the order of the chords at the very end.

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Chords order for the verse

A# (x1)	A# major (x2)	D / F / A#

A (x1 or x2)	A minor (x4)	C / E / A
↑ ↑	REPEAT 2 TIMES	↑ ↑
D (x1)	D minor (x2)	D / F / A
A (x1)	A minor (x2)	C / E / A
↑ ↑	REPEAT 3 TIMES	↑ ↑
A# (x1)	A# major (x2)	D / F / A#
C (x1)	C major (x2)	C / E / G

To play the verse in its entirety, you'll need to play this chart just once, following its different sections. After that, you'll come across the second chorus, which is played the same way as the first. The second verse will also be played just like the first.

Finally, you can finish the song using the chart below.
